Highlights of 2020/Goals for 2021:

Priority #1 Lake Health — Due to the continuing effectiveness of the herbicide treatment, only a series of small treatments for Eurasian Water Milfoil. We didn't need to treat lily pads.

We continued a program to monitor and control zebra mussels. We developed a process to monitor them using the device in the image and mapping the growth pattern. In short, zebra mussels are now the biggest issue this lake has faced. We did the first series of treatments with Earthtec QZ.

The results were posted on the Highland Lake website. In short there was a noticeable reduction and the monitoring devices showed a 56% decrease in zebra mussel bio mass. For 2021 we are planning to seek grant funding and expand the program.




Working with Lake County we have also continued a project with NASA monitoring our lake level.

Priority #2 Fiscal Responsibility — Financial information is regularly posted to the website. An audit of the financial records was conducted by John Hall.

Priority #3 Communication — The website and Facebook page are great sources of information regarding our lake and community activities. There is a growing number of postings to both platforms.

Priority #4 Community Relations — We will continue community activities such as the "Welcome Wagon" for new residents, the annual community dinner (the date will be moved due to COVID), Carp fest, tailgate party, movie night and the Ice Fishing Derby. Did I mention THE Carp fest? The Lake Ave. restoration project moved forward with further clearing of invasive species and thanks to Dave Coulter, the seeding of native plants. The area is developing as planned.

Raft — The raft was a huge success. It still needs a little more work and protection from zebra mussels.
