Highland Lake Boat Launching Rules:

Boats intended to be launched into Highland Lake must have debris removed. Boats must be drained, dried and be disinfected (**) or remain in dry storage for 7 days to ensure against the introduction of aquatic invasive species (i.e. zebra or quagga mussels).

Highland Lake Parks/Lake Access Points Boat Storage Rules:

All boats stored in parks/lake access points must belong to dues paying association members. Each dues paying association member is limited to storing up to two (2) boats. Boats stored at parks/lake access points must clearly display Highland Lake boat stickers and boat numbers that link the boat to the homeowner (see Highland Lake Boat Stickers). Boats must be stored in designated areas so as not to interfere or impede access to others. Any boat located on the HLPOA property that fails to comply with these regulations will be sold at auction or salvaged. Please note that an attempt will be made to identify and notify the boat owner in order to provide notice of noncompliance and to provide opportunity to comply or remove boat.

Highland Lake Boat Launching via Independent Contractors Rules:

Independent contractors, launching resident's boats, must be accompanied by the resident and a board member(*). The independent contractor must provide verification that the contractor's equipment has been treated for invasive species. If the contractor cannot provide verification, the boat, trailer and equipment must be disinfected or washed with a hot water power washer (**). The resident and/or accompanying board member must fill out the Boat Inspection Sheet and provide a copy to the board for records.
